believing that everyone should have access to quality physical and mental health services.

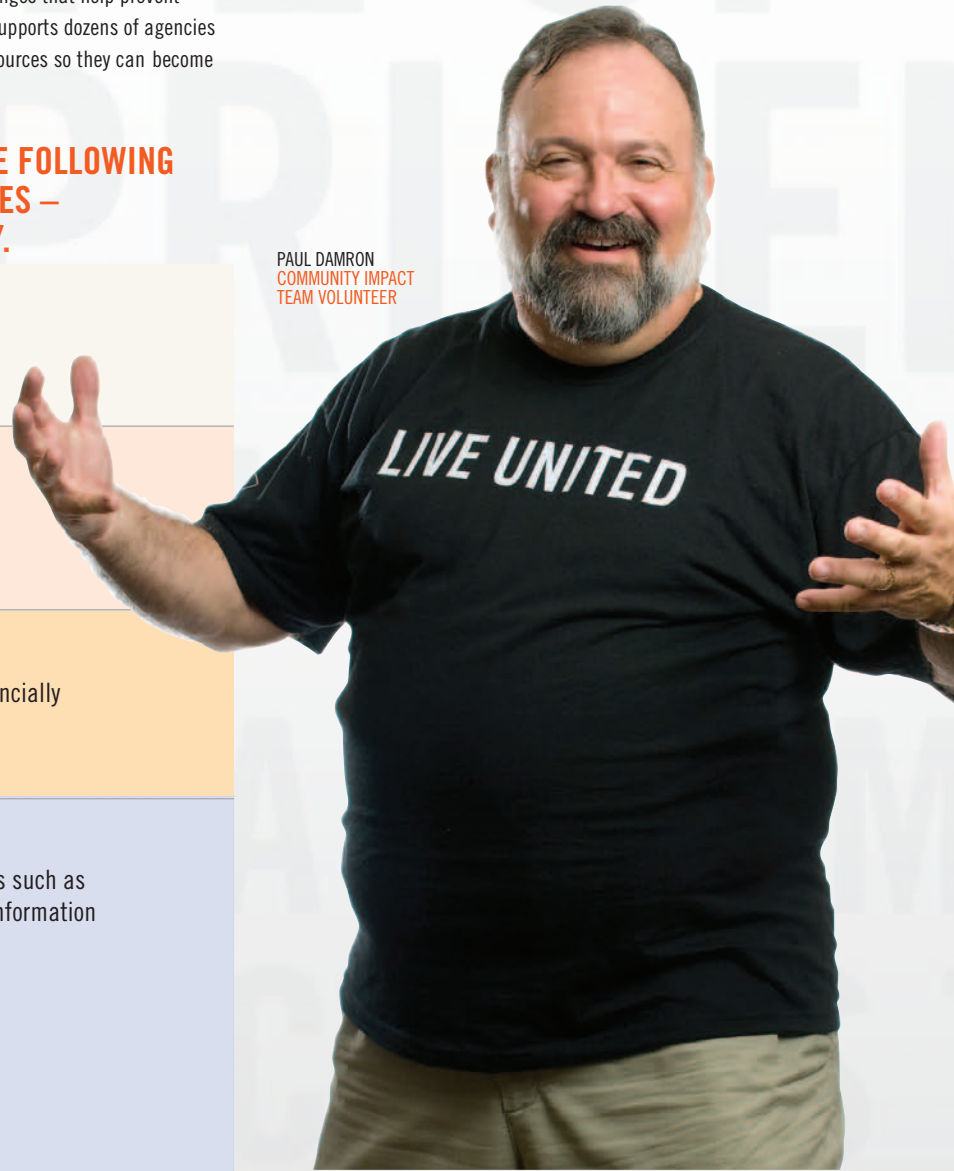
INCOME —

MEET JIM.

Jim completed the outpatient drug counseling program at **Maryhaven** and has remained clean and sober for the past 15 months. He is successfully employed and even trains new hires. Jim is proud that he's now the father and husband he could not be when addiction ruled his life. He also chairs a Narcotics Anonymous meeting once a week. Jim is working to obtain his high school diploma and plans to go to college so that he can become trained to help others overcome addictive illness.

MEET HOWARD.

They've been married half a century, but now she's in a nursing home. Howard receives hospice care in his home, but is often weak and tired, and can no longer drive. **Concord Counseling's** senior support program provides Howard transportation from his home in Delaware County to the nursing home miles away in Franklin County so that he can see, touch, and share with his wife. They may not live under the same roof anymore, but they are still together.

MEET SHARON.

After leaving her husband from a long and abusive marriage, Sharon found a safe haven through **Turning Point's** domestic violence shelter. While healing emotionally and preparing her safety plan, Sharon was referred to **Legal Aid**. An attorney helped Sharon file tax returns from several years, resulting in refunds. This helped her move into an apartment and to purchase an inexpensive and reliable car, which enabled her to find a job. Sharon has taken back her life, and for the first time ever is financially stable, supporting herself and her family on her own.
